

**John A. Levin '60, '63 LL.B. – New York, New York**  
Chief Executive Officer, Levin Capital Strategies, LP

After receiving his law degree from Yale, Mr. Levin was a partner and Director of Research at Loeb, Rhoades & Company from 1963 to 1976. In 1976, he became a partner at Steinhardt Partners, leaving in 1982 to found John A. Levin & Co., Inc. In 1997, Levin & Co. was acquired by Baker, Fentress & Company, and Mr. Levin remained as Chairman and CEO of that publicly traded company until September 2005. In January 2006, Mr. Levin started Levin Capital Strategies, LP, which manages assets for institutional and private investors. Mr. Levin served on the Yale Corporation Investment Committee and is a member of the Board of Advisors of the Yale School of Management. He serves as a Trustee on several non-profit boards including Mt. Sinai Medical Center and Educational Broadcasting Corporation and is a former Trustee of New York University. In 1997 Mr. Levin established the John A. Levin Term Fellowship at the Yale School of Management for international summer internships in the emerging markets program. Mr. Levin is married to his wife Betty for 52 years and all four of his children hold Yale degrees.
