Jackie C. Klaber '12 is a Managing Director, Head of Opportunistic Investing at Rockefeller Capital Management, where she is also a member of the Management Committee, the New Products Committee, the Manager Selection Committee, and the Rockefeller Capital NextGen Leadership Council. Ms. Klaber previously worked at Goldman Sachs' Alternative Investments & Manager Selection division, where she was responsible for sourcing and diligencing a range of alternative investments over time, including in hedge funds, private equity, and credit, and where she served as a Business Unit Manager and as a Member of the Data Science Committee. From 2012-2014, she worked at Citigroup with the management team of the Investment Banking division and also has experience at the U.S. Department of the Treasury, Covington & Burling LLP, and the Yale Investments Office. Ms. Klaber earned a JD/MBA from Yale Law School and Yale School of Management, and was an editor of the Yale Law Journal. Ms. Klaber received her bachelor's degree from Yale College and a master's degree from Columbia University. She is a member of the New York State Bar Association and the Brookings Council as well as a Term Member at the Council on Foreign Relations. She serves on the Board of the Yale Law School Fund.

Jonathan Lewinsohn '06 is the co-founder and Managing Partner of Diameter Capital Partners LP, an investment firm focused on the full spectrum of credit, from performing to distressed. Prior to founding Diameter, he was a Senior Managing Director at Centerbridge Partners and was previously Head of NA Research and a member of the Investment Committee at Anchorage Capital Group. Earlier in his career, Mr. Lewinsohn served as a law clerk to Judge Richard A. Posner of the U.S. Court of Appeals and worked at Morgan Stanley in the Mergers & Acquisitions Group. Mr. Lewinsohn has been published in the Yale Law Journal, the Yale Journal of International Law, and in Antitrust Law Stories (2007 Foundation Press). He received his J.D. from Yale Law School, where he was an editor of the Yale Law Journal, and his B.A., summa cum laude, from Cornell University's College of Arts and Sciences, where he was Phi Beta Kappa and recognized as a Merrill Presidential Scholar. He served five years as a Term Member of the Council on Foreign Relations and is currently a member of the Economic Club of New York.

Rizwan Sabar '07 is the Founder and Senior Portfolio Manager of Zade Capital, a Millennium platform company. Prior to founding the firm, Mr. Sabar served as Head of U.S. Equities at York Capital Management since 2019. Prior to joining York Capital Management, Mr. Sabar was a Partner at Corvex Management where he was responsible for long-short equity investments across a range of sectors as well as special situation and activist investments. Before joining Corvex in 2013, Mr. Sabar was an Associate with Perry Capital, a multi-strategy hedge fund where he focused on long-short equities,

event-driven equities, and distressed debt. Prior to Perry Capital, Mr. Sabar was an Associate with Goldman Sachs' Financial Institutions Group within the investment banking division. Mr. Sabar also served as a law clerk on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit. Mr. Sabar received a B.A. in Economics from Stanford University in 2004 and a J.D. from Yale Law School in 2007, where he served as Comments Editor on the Yale Law Journal.

Henry P. Davis '93 is a Partner at Select Equity Group, where he is a member of the firm's Management Committee, Executive Committee and Compensation Committee, and is responsible for the oversight of several business functions including business and product development, investor relations, client service and communications. At SEG, Mr. Davis manages approximately \$50 billion across long-only and long/short equity strategies. Prior to its acquisition by Aberdeen Asset Management PLC, Mr. Davis was President of Arden Asset Management LLC, a hedge fund specialist with over \$10 billion in assets that created and managed portfolios for institutional and individual clients. At Arden, Mr. Davis was Chairman of the Executive Committee, member of the Investment Committee and Partner of the firm. He was also Chief Executive Officer and Chair of the Board of Directors of Arden Investments Series Trust. Mr. Davis was responsible for several strategic initiatives, including developing Arden's managed account platform for institutional clients in 2014 and leading the team that launched Arden's first mutual fund in 2012. Mr. Davis was also involved in manager research and portfolio management for each of the Arden funds and previously was a Managing Director responsible for supervising Arden's research activities since 2001. Prior to joining Arden, Mr. Davis was an investment advisor and an attorney specializing in corporate and asset management work. Mr. Davis is a graduate of Yale Law School and Cornell University, where he graduated summa cum laude and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa.

John McCormick '95 is currently an Associate Research Scholar at Yale Law School and until recently was Global Group Head of Blackstone Alternative Asset Management ("BAAM"), the \$82 billion AUM hedge fund division of The Blackstone Group, where he led the division to record financial results for Blackstone shareholders and strong investment performance for institutional clients.
